It's feeling more like summer than spring these days, and as the days continue to get longer, we find ourselves busier than ever at CPAWS-OV! With events and other programming, it is an exciting time, but first we would like to talk to you about something a little more serious.

# Say no to Bill 5 - Send a letter to your MPP today!

If you live in Ontario, you may be aware of the Ontario government's proposed Bill 5, titled "Protect Ontario by Unleashing Our Economy." As a supporter of CPAWS-OV, we know you share our concerns about the serious consequences this bill would have on Ontario's environment, Indigenous rights, and species at risk.

If passed, Bill 5 would weaken environmental protections, opening ecologically sensitive areas—wetlands, old-growth forests, and species-at-risk habitats—to industrial development with minimal oversight. Instead of careful stewardship, these vital ecosystems could face unchecked

exploitation.

A major concern is the bill's redefinition of "habitat," limiting protections to an animal's immediate dwelling while disregarding essential migration, feeding, and breeding areas. This narrow definition undermines efforts to safeguard at-risk species through a whole-habitat approach.

Bill 5 also dismisses Indigenous rights by removing the requirement for Free, Prior, and Informed Consent (FPIC), allowing development on Indigenous lands without proper consultation. We urge you to speak out against this bill and advocate for policies that protect Ontario's environment and uphold Indigenous rights. The bill also proposes to establish 'special economic zones' where further rollbacks of regulations, potentially even including labour standards, would take place to spur development in an un-checked fashion.

Bill 5 is open for comment until Saturday, May 17<sup>th</sup>. There is still time to let your voices be heard. Below, you will find a pre-written message that you can send to your MPP and to the Minister of Energy and Mines who is responsible for bill 5, the Honourable Stephen Lecce, to voice your concern. You will also find a link to the Ontario Legislature website where you can find the contact information for your MPP.

This bill would violate established legal precedents that protect Indigenous rights, setting a dangerous precedent for future legislation.

I urge you to oppose Bill 5 and use your platform to advocate for policies that prioritize environmental conservation and uphold Indigenous rights. Ontario's future depends on responsible stewardship of our natural resources and respect for the rights of all peoples.
